14. A indicação dos candidatos será feita por examinador, segundo as notas por ele conferidas.

15. Será proposto para nomeação o candidato que obtiver o maior número de indicações da comissão julgadora.

16. A posse do candidato indicado ficará sujeita à aprovação em exame médico realizado pelo Departamento de Perícias Médicas do Estado – DPME, nos termos do Artigo 47, VI, da Lei nº 10.261/68.

17. A nomeação do docente aprovado no concurso, assim como as demais providências decorrentes serão regidas pelos termos da Resolução nº 7271 de 2016.

The Dean of the Institute of Biomedical Sciences of the University of São Paulo announces to all interested parties that, as decided by the Congregation in its ordinary session held on August 28, 2024, will be open for a period of 90 days, starting at 8:00 am (Brasília time) on September, 05, 2024, and ending at 4:00 pm (Brasília time) on December, 03, 2024, registrations for the public contest for titles and tests to fill 01 (one) position of Professor Doctor, reference MS-3.1, under RDIDP Regime, course/position nº 1244337, with salary of R\$ 15.498,97 (Fifteen thousand, four hundred and ninety-eight reais and ninety-seven cents), referring to the month of May 2024, together with Department of Anatomy, in the area of knowledge in Anatomy (Program in Morphofunctional Sciences), pursuant to art. 125, paragraph 1, of the USP General Regulations, and the respective program that follows:

 - Morphological and functional aspects of the osteo-articular system
 - Morphofunctional aspects of the Muscular System

The contest will be conducted by Constitutional Principles for Public Administration, notably that of impersonality, as well as the provisions of the Statute and the General Rules of the University of São Paulo and the Rules of the Institute of Biomedical Sciences.

- Applications for registration must be made exclusively through the link <https://uspdigital.usp.br/gr/admissao> within the period indicated above, and the candidate must submit an application addressed to the Director of the Institute of Biomedical Sciences <https://www3.icb.usp.br/con/editalis-formularios-para-registracao/>, containing personal data and area of knowledge (specialty) of the Department for which you are applying, attaching the following documents:
 - detailed memorandum and evidence of the published works, the activities carried out related to the competition and other information that allows the evaluation of their merits, in digital format;
 - proof that you hold the title of Doctor granted by USP, recognized by I or valid nationally;
 - proof of discharge from military service for male candidates;
 - electoral discharge certificate or detailed certificate issued by the Electoral Justice less than 30 days before the beginning of the enrollment period;
 - official identity document;
 - research project, in digital format, prepared in the specialties belonging to the area of knowledge of this public notice.
- Supporting elements of the memorial referred to in item 1, such as models, works of art or other materials that cannot be digitized must be presented by the last working day before the start of the competition.
 - links from Dropbox or Google Drive or any other referring to the page subject to alteration by the candidate will not be accepted as proof of the items contained in the memorial;
 - For the purposes of item 1, minutes of defense will not be accepted without information on homologation when the granting of the Doctor's title depends on this measure within the scope of the issuing Educational Institution, being the candidate already aware that in this case the absence of proof of such approval will result in the rejection of your registration.
 - Professors working at USP will be exempt from the requirements referred to in items III and IV, provided that they have proven due discharge at the time of their initial contract.
 - Foreign candidates will be exempt from the requirements of items III and IV, and must prove that they are in good standing in Brazil.
 - The foreign candidate approved in the competition and indicated to fill the position may only take office if he presents a temporary or permanent visa that allows him to carry out remunerated activity in Brazil.
 - At the time of registration, candidates with disabilities must submit a request for the necessary conditions to be provided for the tests.
 - It is the candidate's full responsibility to upload each of their documents in the specific field indicated by the system in the link <https://uspdigital.usp.br/gr/admissao>, and the candidate is already aware that uploading documents in a different order from the one established there will imply the rejection of his application.
 - It is the candidate's full responsibility to present their documents in their entirety (front and back) and in a readable file, and the candidate is already aware that, if they do not remedy any irregularity in the document upload during the registration period incomplete or illegible, your entry will be rejected.
 - The extemporaneous presentation of documents by the candidate will not be admitted, even at the appeal level.

- Upon registration, the candidate who declares himself to be black, brown or indigenous will express his interest in participating in the differentiated score provided for in item 11 and its paragraphs of this Public Notice.
- In order to be entitled to the bonus for self-declared black and brown candidates, the candidate must have phenotypic traits that characterize him as black, brown or indigenous.
- The self-declaration as black or brown made by the candidate who expresses his interest in participating in the differentiated score will be subject to confirmation by means of a hetero-identification bank.
- In the event of non-confirmation of the self-declaration of racial belonging, the candidate will be eliminated from the contest and, if nominated, will be subject to the annulment of his admission to public service or employment, after an administrative procedure in which he is assured the contradictory and full defense, without prejudice to other applicable sanctions.
- In order to confirm the self-declaration of the indigenous candidate, the Administrative Birth Registration of the Indian - Rani or, in the absence of this, the Administrative Birth Registration of an Indian - Rani of one of his/her parents will be required.
- Exceptional situations may be evaluated by the Council for Inclusion and Belonging, which may admit confirmation of the candidate's self-declaration as an indigenous person through, cumulatively, a memorial and a declaration of ethnic belonging signed by chiefs, taxauas, indigenous leaders of communities, associations and/or representative organizations of the indigenous peoples of the respective regions, under the penalties of the Law.
- Upon registration, the candidate may express, in writing, the intention to take the tests in English, pursuant to § 8 of article 135 of the General Regulations. The contents of the tests carried out in English and Portuguese will be identical.
- If the candidate who took the test in a foreign language is nominated, it is the expectation of the Institute of Biomedical Sciences that he/she becomes fluent in Portuguese in a maximum of two years.
- The inscriptions will be judged by the Congregation or the Institute of Biomedical Sciences, in its formal aspect, publishing the decision in a public notice.
 - Sole Paragraph – The contest must be held within thirty to one hundred and twenty days, counting from the date of publication in the Official Gazette of the State of the approval of entries, in accordance with article 134, sole paragraph, of the General Rules of USP.
 - The contest will be carried out according to objective criteria, in two phases, through the attribution of marks in tests, divided as follows:
 - stage (elimination) – written test – weight 02
 - 2nd phase – I) Judgment of the memorial with public proof of argument – weight 05
 - II) didactic test – weight 03
 - The call for applicants to take the tests will be published in the Official Gazette of the State.
 - Candidates who present themselves after the established time will not be able to take the tests.
 - The written test, which will deal with a general and doctrinal subject, will be carried out in accordance with the provisions of art. 139, and its sole paragraph, of the USP General Regulations.
 - the commission will organize a list of ten points, based on the competition program and will inform the candidates, 24 (twenty-four) hours before the point draw, being allowed to require the candidates to carry out other activities in that period;
 - the candidate may propose the replacement of points, immediately after becoming aware of their statements, if they understand that they do not belong to the contest program, and the judging committee will decide, at the outset, on the origin of the allegation;
 - the non-extendable period of five hours of duration of the test begins;
 - for sixty minutes, after the draw, consultation with books, periodicals and other bibliographic documents will be allowed;
 - the notes taken during the consultation period may be used during the course of the test, and must be made on paper indicated by the committee and attached to the final test;
 - the test, which will be read in a public session by the candidate, must be reproduced in copies made available in Portable Document File (PDF) format, which will be delivered to the members of the judging committee, when the session opens;
 - each test will be evaluated individually by the members of the judging committee;
 - candidates who obtain a minimum score of seven from the majority of the members of the judging committee will be considered qualified for the second phase;
 - the judging commission will present, in a public session, the grades received by the candidates.
 - At the end of the assessment of the written test, each candidate will receive a final grade from each examiner, observing the possible application of the differentiated score under the terms of item 11 of this Public Notice.
 - Only candidates approved in the first phase will participate in the second phase.
 - The judgment of the memorial, expressed through a global score, including questioning and evaluation, must reflect the merit of the candidate.
 - Sole Paragraph – When judging the memorial, the commission will assess:
 - scientific, literary, philosophical or artistic production;
 - university didactic activity;
 - activities related to providing services to the community;
 - professional or other activities, when applicable;
 - diplomas and other university dignities;
 - The didactic test will be public, with a minimum duration of forty and a maximum of sixty minutes, and will deal with the program of the aforementioned area of knowledge, under the terms of article 137 of the USP General Regulations.
 - the judging commission, based on the competition program, will organize a list of ten points, which the candidates will be aware of immediately before the point draw;
 - the candidate may propose the replacement of points, immediately after becoming aware of their statements, if they understand that they do not belong to the contest program, and the judging committee will decide, at the outset, on the origin of the allegation;
 - the test will take place 24 (twenty-four) hours after the drawing of the point, which will be at the candidate's free disposal, not being required to carry out other activities during this period;
 - the candidate may use the didactic material he deems necessary;
 - if the number of candidates so requiring, they will be divided into groups of a maximum of three, observing the order of registration, for the purposes of drawing lots and carrying out the test;
 - when the 60th (sixtieth) minute of the test is reached, the Judging Committee must interrupt the candidate;
 - if the candidate's presentation ends less than the 40th minute of the test, the examiners must give the candidate a zero score in the respective test.

- At the end of the assessment of the tests, each candidate will receive a final score from each examiner, which will be the weighted average of the scores given by him in the two phases, observing the weights mentioned in item 3 and the eventual application of the differentiated score under the terms of item 11 of this notice.
- Grades of the tests may vary from zero to ten, with approximation to the first decimal place.
- Different scores will be applied to black, brown and indigenous candidates, under the terms specified herein.
 - the formula for calculating the differentiated score to be attributed to blacks, browns and indigenous people, in all phases of the public contest is:

$$PD = (MCA - MCPPI) / MCPPI$$
 Where:
 - PD is the differentiated score to be added to the scores, at each stage of the public tender, of all black, brown or indigenous candidates who have expressed interest in participating in the differentiated score.
 - MCA is the average score of the broad competition among all candidates who scored, excluding the disqualified, that is, those who did not reach the minimum score referred to in items 4 and 13 of this Notice. "Broad competition" is understood as all candidates who scored and who did not declare themselves as black, brown or indigenous and those who, having declared themselves black, brown or indigenous, chose not to participate in the differentiated scoring.
 - MCPPI is the average PPI competition score among all scoring candidates, excluding disqualified candidates.
 - The formula for applying the differentiated score to the final grades of blacks, browns and indigenous people in each phase of the public contest is:

$$NFCPPI = (1 + PD) * NSCPPI$$
 Where:
 - NFCPPI is the final score in the public tender phase, after applying the differentiated score and which will generate the candidate's classification in the public tender stage, limited to the maximum score provided for in the public notice. At the end of the public tender phase, the final grade will be considered the simple grade of the candidate.
 - NSCPPI is the simple score of the beneficiary candidate, on which the differentiated score will be applied.
 - The calculations referred to in §§ 1 and 2 of this item must consider two decimal places and fractions greater than or equal to 0.5 (five tenths) must be rounded to the next whole number.
 - The differentiated score (PD) provided for in this item applies to all eligible beneficiaries, that is, those who have reached the minimum performance established in the bidding notice, considered, for this last purpose, the simple score.
 - In the absence of candidates benefiting from the differentiated score among the qualified ones, the differentiated score will not be calculated.
 - The differentiated score will not be applied when, in the formula for calculating the differentiated score (PD), the MCPPI (average score of the PPI competition) is greater than the MCA (average score of the broad competition).
 - The result of the competition will be proclaimed by the judging commission immediately after its conclusion, in a public session.
 - Candidates who obtain, from the majority of examiners, a minimum final grade of seven will be considered qualified.
 - The nomination of candidates will be made by an examiner, according to the grades conferred by him.
 - The candidate who obtains the highest number of nominations from the judging committee will be proposed for nomination.
 - The tenure of the nominated candidate will be subject to approval in a medical examination carried out by the Department of Medical Expertise of the State - DPME, pursuant to Article 47, VI, of Law No. 10.261/68.
 - The appointment of the professor approved in the competition, as well as the other resulting measures will be governed by the terms of Resolution No. 7271 of 2016.
 - RDIDP professors must maintain an exclusive employment relationship with USP, pursuant to article 197 of USP's General Regulations.
 - The competition will be valid immediately and only the candidate indicated for the post in the competition will be proposed for appointment.
 - The candidate will be called to take office by the Official Gazette of the State.

V – as anotações efetuadas durante o período de consulta poderão ser utilizadas na decorrer da prova, devendo ser feitas em papel fabricado pela comissão e anexadas ao texto final;

VI – a prova, que será lida em sessão pública no local final, deverá ser reproduzida em cópias disponibilizadas em formato Portable Document File (PDF) que serão entregues aos membros da comissão julgadora, a os abrir a sessão;

VII – cada prova será avaliada, individualmente, pelos membros da comissão julgadora;

VIII – serão considerados habilitados para a segunda fase os candidatos que obtiverem, da maioria dos membros da comissão julgadora, nota mínima sete;

IX – a comissão julgadora apresentará, em sessão pública, as notas recebidas pelos candidatos.

5. Ao término da apreciação da prova escrita, cada candidato terá de cada examinador uma nota final, observada a eventual aplicação da pontuação diferenciada nos termos do item 11 deste Edital.

6. Participarão da segunda fase somente os candidatos aprovados na primeira fase.

7. O julgamento do memorial, expresso mediante nota global, incluindo arguição e avaliação, deverá refletir o mérito do candidato.

10. As notas das provas poderão variar de zero a dez, com aproximação até a primeira casa decimal.

11. Aplicar-se-á pontuação diferenciada aos candidatos pretos, pardos e indígenas, nos termos ora especificados.

§ 1º - A fórmula de cálculo da pontuação diferenciada a ser atribuída a pretos, pardos e indígenas, em todas as fases do concurso público é:

PD = (MCA – MCPPI) / MCPPI

Onde:

- PD é a pontuação diferenciada a ser acrescida às notas, em cada fase do concurso público, de todos os candidatos pretos, pardos ou indígenas que manifestaram interesse em participar da pontuação diferenciada.

The Dean of the Institute of Biomedical Sciences of the University of São Paulo announces to all interested parties that, as decided by the Congregation in its ordinary session held on August 28, 2024, will be open for a period of 90 days, starting at 8:00 am (Brasília time) on September 05, 2024, and ending at 4:00 pm (Brasília time) on December 03, 2024, registrations for the public contest for titles and tests to fill 02 (two) positions of Professor Doctor, reference MS-3.1, under RDIDP Regime, course/position nº 1025562, with salary of R\$ 15.498,97 (fifteen thousand, four hundred and ninety-eight reais and ninety-seven cents), referring to the month of May 2024, together with Department of Physiology and Biophysics, in the area of General Physiology, pursuant to art. 125, paragraph 1, of the USP General Regulations, and the respective program that follows:

1. BIOPHYSICS
1.1. Cell membranes and their transport proteins (channels and transporters).

1.2. Electrophysiology of the cell membrane: ionic basis of membrane potentials, electrical model of a cell membrane, molecular physiology of ion channels.

I – detailed memorandum and evidence of the published works, the activities carried out related to the competition and other information that allows the evaluation of their merits, in digital format;

II – proof that you hold the title of Doctor granted by USP, recognized by it or valid nationally;

III – proof of discharge from military service for male candidates;

IV – electoral discharge certificate or detailed certificate issued by the Electoral Justice less than 30 days before the beginning of the enrollment period;

V – official identity document.

VI – research project, in digital format, prepared in the specialties belonging to the area of knowledge of this public notice.

§ 1 - Supporting elements of the memorial referred to in item 1, such as models, works of art or other materials that cannot be digitized must be presented by the last working day before the start of the competition.

Links from Dropbox or Google Drive or any other referring to the page subject to alteration by the candidate will not be accepted as proof of the items contained in the memorial.

§ 3 - For the purposes of item II, minutes of defense will not be accepted without information on homologation when the granting of the Doctor's title depends on this measure within the scope of the issuing Educational Institution, being the candidate

already aware that in this case the absence of proof of such approval will result in the rejection of your registration.

§ 4 - Professors working at USP will be exempt from the requirements referred to in items III and IV, provided that they have proven due discharge at the time of their initial contract.

§ 5 - Foreign candidates will be exempt from the requirements of items III and IV, and must prove that they are in good standing in Brazil.

§ 6 - The foreign candidate approved in the competition and indicated to fill the position may only take office if he presents a temporary or permanent visa that allows him to carry out remunerated activity in Brazil.

§ 7 - At the time of registration, candidates with disabilities must submit a request for the necessary conditions to be provided for the tests.

§ 8 - It is the candidate's full responsibility to upload each of their documents in the specific field indicated by the system in the link <https://uspdigital.usp.br/gr/admissao>, and the candidate is already aware that uploading documents in a different order from the one established there will imply the rejection of his application.

§ 9 - It is the candidate's full responsibility to present their documents in their entirety (front and back) and in a readable file, and the candidate is already aware that, if they do not remedy any irregularity in the document upload during the registration period incomplete or illegible, your entry will be rejected.

§ 10 - The extemporaneous presentation of documents by the candidate will not be admitted, even at the appeal level.

§ 11 - Upon registration, the candidate who declares himself to be black, brown or indigenous will express his interest in participating in the differentiated score provided for in item 11 and its paragraphs of this Public Notice.

§ 12 - In order to be entitled to the bonus for self-declared black and brown candidates, the candidate must have phenotypic traits that characterize him as black, black or brown.

§ 13 - The self-declaration as black or brown made by the candidate who expresses his interest in participating in the differentiated score will be subject to confirmation by means of a hetero-identification bank.

§ 14 - In the event of non-confirmation of the self-declaration of racial belonging, the candidate will be eliminated from the contest and, if nominated, will be subject to the annulment of his admission to public service or employment, after an administrative procedure in which he is assured the contradictory and full defense, without prejudice to other applicable sanctions.

§ 15 - In order to confirm the self-declaration of the indigenous candidate, the Administrative Birth Registration of the Indian - Rani or, in the absence of this, the Administrative Birth Registration of an Indian - Rani of one of his/her parents will be required.

§ 16 - Exceptional situations may be evaluated by the Council for Inclusion and Belonging, which may admit confirmation of the candidate's self-declaration as an indigenous person through, cumulatively, a memorial and a declaration of ethnic belonging signed by chiefs, taxauas, indigenous leaders of communities, associations and/or representative organizations of the indigenous peoples of the respective regions, under the penalties of the Law.

§ 17 - Upon registration, the candidate may express, in writing, the intention to take the tests in English, pursuant to § 8 of article 135 of the General Regulations. The contents of the tests carried out in English and Portuguese will be identical.

§ 18 - If the candidate who took the test in a foreign language is nominated, it is the expectation of the Institute of Biomedical Sciences that he/she becomes fluent in Portuguese in a maximum of two years.

22. The inscriptions will be judged by the Congregation or the Institute of Biomedical Sciences, in its formal aspect, publishing the decision in a public notice.

Sole Paragraph – The contest must be held within thirty to one hundred and twenty days, counting from the date of publication in the Official Gazette of the State of the approval of entries, in accordance with article 134, sole paragraph, of the General Rules of USP.

23. The contest will be carried out according to objective criteria, in two phases, through the attribution of marks in tests, divided as follows:

1st phase (elimination) – written test – weight 02

2nd phase – I) Judgment of the memorial with public proof of argument - weight 05

II) didactic test - weight 03

§ 1 - The call for applicants to take the tests will be published in the Official Gazette of the State.

§ 2 - Candidates who present themselves after the established time will not be able to take the tests.

24. The written test, which will deal with a general and didactic subject, will be carried out in accordance with the provisions of art. 139, and its sole paragraph, of the USP General Regulations.

I – the commission will organize a list of ten points, based on the competition program and will inform the candidates, 24 (twenty-four) hours before the point draw, being allowed to require the candidates to carry out other activities in that period;

II – the candidate may propose the replacement of points, immediately after becoming aware of their statements, if they understand that they do not belong to the contest program, and the judging committee will decide, at the outset, on the origin of the allegation;

III – once the point is drawn, the non-extendable period of five hours of duration of the test begins;

IV – for sixty minutes, after the draw, consultation with books, periodicals and other bibliographic documents will be allowed;

V – the notes taken during the consultation period may be used during the course of the test, and must be made on paper initiated by the committee and attached to the final text;

VI - the test, which will be read in a public session by the candidate, must be reproduced in copies made available in Portable Document File (PDF) format, which will be delivered to the members of the judging committee, when the session opens;

VII – each test will be evaluated individually by the members of the judging committee;

VIII – candidates who obtain a minimum score of seven from the majority of the members of the judging committee will be considered qualified for the second phase;

IX – the judging commission will present, in a public session, the grades received by the candidates.

25. At the end of the assessment of the written test, each candidate will receive a final grade from each examiner, observing the possible application of the differentiated score under the terms of item 11 of this Public Notice.

26. Only candidates approved in the first phase will participate in the second phase.

27. The judgment of the memorial, expressed through a global score, including questioning and evaluation, must reflect the merit of the candidate.

Sole Paragraph – When judging the memorial, the commission will assess:

I – scientific, literary, philosophical or artistic production;

II – university didactic activity;

III – activities related to providing services to the community;

IV – professional or other activities, when applicable;

V – diplomas and other university dignities.

28. The didactic test will be public, with a minimum duration of forty and a maximum of sixty minutes, and will deal with the program of the aforementioned area of knowledge, under the terms of article 137 of the USP General Regulations.

I – the judging commission, based on the competition program, will organize a list of ten points, which the candidates will be aware of immediately before the point draw;

II – the candidate may propose the replacement of points, immediately after becoming aware of their statements, if they understand that they do not belong to the contest program, and the judging committee will decide, at the outset, on the origin of the allegation;

III – the test will take place 24 (twenty-four) hours after the drawing of the point, which will be at the candidate's free disposal, not being required to carry out other activities during this period;

IV – the candidate may use the didactic material he deems necessary;

V – if the number of candidates so requires, they will be divided into groups of a maximum of three, observing the order of registration, for the purposes of drawing lots and carrying out the test;

VI – when the 60th (sixtieth) minute of the test is reached, the Judging Committee must interrupt the candidate;

VII – if the candidate's presentation ends less than the 40th minute of the test, the examiners must give the candidate a zero score in the respective test.

29. At the end of the assessment of the tests, each candidate will receive a final score from each examiner, which will be the weighted average of the scores given by him in the two phases, observing the weights mentioned in item 3 and the eventual application of the differentiated score under the terms of item 11 of this notice.

30. The grades of the tests may vary from zero to ten, with approximation to the first decimal place.

31. Different scores will be applied to black, brown and indigenous candidates, under the terms specified herein.

§ 1 - The formula for calculating the differentiated score to be attributed to blacks, browns and indigenous people, in all phases of the public contest is:

PD = (MCA – MCPPI) / MCPPI

Where:

- PD is the differentiated score to be added to the scores, at each stage of the public tender, of all black, brown or indigenous candidates who have expressed interest in participating in the differentiated score.

- MCA is the average score of the broad competition among all candidates who scored, excluding the disqualified, that is, those who did not reach the minimum score referred to in items 4 and 13 of this Notice. "Broad competition" is understood as all candidates who scored and who did not declare themselves as black, brown or indigenous and those who, having declared themselves black, brown or indigenous, chose not to participate in the differentiated scoring.

- MCPPI is the average PPI competition score among all scoring candidates, excluding disqualified candidates.

§ 2 - The formula for applying the differentiated score to the final grades of blacks, browns and indigenous people in each phase of the public contest is:

NFCPPI = (1 + PD) * NSCPPI

Where:

- NFCPPI is the final score in the public tender phase, after applying the differentiated score and which will generate the candidate's classification in the public tender stage, limited to the maximum score provided for in the public notice. At the end of the public tender phase, the final grade will be considered the simple grade of the candidate.

- NSCPPI is the simple score of the beneficiary candidate, on which the differentiated score will be applied.

§ 3 - The calculations referred to in § 2 of this item must consider two decimal places and fractions greater than or equal to 0.5 (five tenths) must be rounded to the next whole number.

§ 4 - The differentiated score (PD) provided for in this item applies to all eligible beneficiaries, that is, those who have reached the minimum performance established in the bidding notice, considered, for this last purpose, the simple score.

§ 5 - In the absence of candidates benefiting from the differentiated score among the qualified ones, the differentiated score will not be calculated.

§ 6 - The differentiated score will not be applied when, in the formula for calculating the differentiated score (PD), the MCPPI (average score of the PPI competition) is greater than the MCA (average score of the broad competition).

32. The result of the competition will be proclaimed by the judging commission immediately after its conclusion, in a public session.

33. Candidates who obtain, from the majority of examiners, a minimum final grade of seven will be considered qualified.

34. The nomination of candidates will be made by an examiner, according to the grades conferred by him.

35. The candidate who obtains the highest number of nominations from the judging committee will be proposed for nomination.

36. The tenure of the nominated candidate will be subject to approval in a medical examination carried out by the Department of Medical Expertise of the State - DPME, pursuant to Article 47, VI, of Law No. 10,261/68.

37. The appointment of the professor approved in the competition, as well as the other resulting measures will be governed by the terms of Resolution No. 7.271 of 2016.

38. RDIDP professors must maintain an exclusive employment relationship with USP, pursuant to article 197 of USP's General Regulations.

39. The competition will be valid immediately and only the candidate indicated for the post in the competition will be proposed for appointment.

40. The candidate will be called to take office by the Official Gazette of the State.
